# 1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

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## 1.1 INTRODUCTION

Bhartiya Shikshan Prasarak Sanstha's (BSPS) Kholeshwar Mahavidyalaya, Ambajogai is at Ambajogai in Beed District of Marathwada region of Maharashtra State and is affiliated to Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University, Chhatrapati Sambhajanagar (Aurangabad). Before independence this region was under the rule of Nizam, It became a part of independent India in 1948.

At this background some teachers from the society had come together and formed BSPS on 28th June 1951, by keeping in the view the needs of the region. The name of the Institution points out that emphasis is on "Bhartiyatwa". Its philosophy is based on the concept of what is essentially Indian in all walks of life. The work was started with the motto "**Kelyane Hot Ahere! Adhi Kelechi Pahije**" (You will definitely achieve your goal but you first have to start working towards it) lines taken from "**Dashbodha**" written by renowned **Marathi Saint Ramdasa**.

With this vision BSPS runs 43 schools and colleges (Sanskar Kendras) at different places in the Marathwada region. In 1972 it started Kholeshwar Mahavidyalaya.

To follow the objectives, Kholeshwar Mahavidyalaya has been working since 1972. This is a co-education college permanently affiliated to Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University, Chhatrapati Sambhajanagar (Aurangabad) having recognition of UGC under sections 2(f) and 12(B). The college is located in the heart of the city and has the campus of 1.87 Acres which include Class Rooms, Administrative Wing, Laboratories, Gymnasium, Ladies Room, Library Building, Reading Room, Grounds, Canteen etc. We have added 5 Acres land for further developments.

The college has Arts and Commerce faculties which provide B.A. and B.Com. programmes on grant in aid basis. In Arts faculty there are 13 departments. In commerce faculty almost 16 subjects are being taught. The college runs B.Sc. programme under science faculty on non-grant basis having 8 departments. College also runs PG courses in Marathi, English and M.Sc. I.T. on non-grant basis.

### Vision

The college works with the vision and mission of our parent body i.e. Bhartiya Shikshan Prasarak Sanstha. Its vision is "**To build a tradition of ideal citizens loyal to democracy, virtuous, scholarly, morally sound, and nationalist through Indian Education**"

The prime need of the society is an ideal citizen who is loyal to democracy. This need is underlined by our mission statement. The citizens should be scholarly, morally sound and nationalist. This is mentioned in our vision and mission. The words like "Morally sound" "Nationalist" "Indian education" express our distinctive characteristics. Our emphasis is on value education.

## **1.3 CRITERIA WISE SUMMARY**

### **Curricular Aspects**

Curriculum and Academic Calendar is given by affiliating university. As per the academic calendar provided by the university, college prepares its own academic calendar which includes month-wise working days, details about co-curricular, extra-curricular and internal assessment. A detailed Annual Teaching plan is made at the beginning of academic year. Teaching process is implemented and monitored as per the plan made by IQAC. Principal (Chairman IQAC), Vice Principals and Head of all the departments monitor the teaching process. For effective monitoring Teachers Academic Diary is maintained by every teacher in which Annual Teaching Plan, Daily Lesson Notes and Monthly Teaching Reports are regularly recorded and timely checked by the authorities.

Courses and curriculum are according to the goals and objectives of the college. They are suitable for overall development of the students and also helps in developing the global competencies among students. It also contains the aspects of value based education. As the instructions by UGC, State Government and University CBCS pattern is accepted.

Several courses and subject options (as per the rules of affiliating University) are available to students so that they can choose appropriate course and subject. Also various skilled based courses are there for the students. Feedback on curriculum is obtained from students and teachers. Teachers give feedback on curriculum to the members of B.O.S. University officers, academic experts and stack holders. Teachers participate in curriculum design and development as and when they get opportunity. Four faculty members contribute in design and development of curriculum as B.O.S. member and special invitee.

### **Teaching-learning and Evaluation**

The admission process is transparent. Admissions are given as per the rules of University and State Government. Admission committee is established to monitor the entire process. Wide publicity of admission process is always made to give access to students from different geographical area and different socio-economic, cultural and educational backgrounds. Admissions are open to all, irrespective of cast, creed, religion, gender etc. Suitable programs are offered as to satisfy the needs of the students from different backgrounds. Commerce faculty admission are given on merit basis. Gender equity and admission opportunity for differently abled students are also ensured.

Teaching process is carefully planned and monitored by authorities. Teaching methods applied by teachers are suitable to make the learning easy. Teachers apply interactive and participatory approach and consider the abilities of students. Teachers use appropriate teaching aids including ICT for effective teaching which makes learning easy. During Covid-19 period all teaching-learning process was online and various e-materials provided to the students. Extra periods are taken wherever necessary. Library resources are effectively used in teaching learning process. Question–answers, group discussions, seminars, wallpapers and other techniques are used in teaching process which are helpful in internal evaluation of the students.

Teachers are well qualified and experienced. The recruitment of teachers is made as per the rules and regulations of the UGC and State Government. Adequate teachers are appointed for all subjects. Teachers are very keen about their professional development, research and extension activities. Teachers participate in orientation courses. Refresher courses, conferences and seminars. Five teachers have recognitions as research guide for Ph.D.

Evaluation process is implemented as per the rules of University. Presently semester system of examination is in force. University conducts the examination process. College conducts internal evaluation. Student's grievances regarding evaluation are promptly addressed as per University rules. Students' performance is encouraging which reflects the learning outcome.

### **Research, Innovations and Extension**

Research committee is established in the college for the promotion of research. Library facility, internet facility, Reading room facility, and other facilities are provided to faculty to facilitate research. Adequate opportunities are given to faculty to participate in conferences and seminars and to present papers. 83% of the faculty have completed Ph.D. and other faculty is doing Ph.D. Five faculty members are working as recognized research guide of the University for Ph.D. Almost all faculty member have presented and published research papers in national and international conferences. At present the consultancy activities are improving. Within next five years the areas of consultancy will be identified and consultancy work will be implemented effectively.

The college encourages students and teachers for extension activities. Various measures are taken to promote these activities. NSS, NCC and other departments are the major mechanisms used for extension activities. The extension activities are organized for the benefit of the community in neighborhood community in rural area. Emphasis is given on Health, Educations, RTI, Environment, and National Integrity through extension activities. Participation of students, teachers and community member is encouraged. Alumni student association is involved in extension activities. Through such activities the college teachers and student work for Institutional social Responsibility.

The college have formal agreement with other institutions. Under various functional MoU's college runs activities like Yog-Shibir, workshops, seminar, student-teacher exchange programme, field trip etc.

## **Infrastructure and Learning Resources**

The college is located in the heart of the city in 1.83 acre area. Adequate infrastructure is available for the efficient conduct of the educational activities. The college have sufficient number of class rooms. Laboratories for practical subjects, separate reading rooms for boys, girls and teachers. The college have play grounds for outdoor games like, Volley-ball, Ball-Badminton, Shuttle-cock, Kabbaddi, Long jump, High jump, Cricket and other athletics. For indoor games like Table-Tennis, Carom, Chess etc. Gymnasium, Parking, Canteen, Health Care Center, Wi-Fi, CCTV and Ramp for Disabled students are available for boys and girls. The college has separate sanitary blocks for boys and girls. There is separate drinking water facility for boys, girls and teachers. The college has one close multipurpose seminar hall and one open auditorium. Well-furnished Principal and Vice Principals cabins, well equipped office and separate Library building is available in the college. Department of Physical education, Examination department, Career and Counseling Cell, Lifelong Learning Department, NSS and NCC, vehicle parking facility is available to students and staff.

The college have a strong library with more than 54,000 books and about 34 journals. It has internet facility, Xerox facility, N-list and OPAC facility. The college have adequate IT infrastructure. The process of Wi-Fi campus is in progress. The maintenance of IT infrastructure is promptly made by the concern department. Computer access is given to all students and faculty.

## **Student Support and Progression**

Efforts are made for students support and progression for smooth working in the college. Competitive exam guidance center, Grievance Redressal cell, various statutory cells and students feedback are the mechanisms for the students support. Competitive exam cell works for career guidance and personality development. Placement cell works for the campus placements of the students to get them good opportunities. Students feedback is obtained regularly to know the difficulties of students and solved. Attempts are made for the students progression to higher studies. Various scholarships and EBC facilities are available for the students.

Participation of students in social, cultural, sports and other activities is ensured through NSS, NCC, Sports, Cultural and other mechanisms and students are rewarded with many awards and recognitions.

## **Governance, Leadership and Management**

The college works under the guidance of LMC and Executive Council of BSPS. The vision, mission and goals of the college are clear and stated. They are communicated to all. There is a sound co-ordination and understanding between the sanstha and college. The college activities are monitored through Principal, Vice Principal, IQAC Coordinator and performed by H.O.D.'s, all teachers and non-teaching staff. Decisions are always participatory. Various committees are in function to perform academic, administrative, curricular, co-curricular, extra-curricular and extension activities. College activities are planned, monitored and implemented carefully. Meetings at opening and at the end of the each term are regularly arranged in which review of all activities is taken, are made for the overall development of teaching and non teaching staff. Performance appraisal of staff is regularly fill-up by the members, dully collected and analyzed. The issue of budget, finance, resources and utilization are regularly discussed and sorted out in LMC meetings. Internal Quality Assurance cell is active and working regularly. It put efforts for quality enhancement of college activities. AQAR's and other reports are prepared by IQAC and sent to NAAC promptly.

As the head of the institution, principal coordinates all the activities. He is assisted by two vice principals and IQAC Coordinator. Monthly academic review meetings are taken. Term wise reports of all activities are collected. All issues are discussed in the meetings of LMC and guidance of sanstha office bearers is sought. E-governance is implemented in all the areas for the smooth and proper functioning. All kinds of audits are done under the guidance of the authorities.

### **Institutional Values and Best Practices**

College is always careful for all round development of students value educations, character building and nationalism. All activities of college are arranged with these objectives. Students and teachers are free from addiction. The teacher student relations are healthy. Environmental awareness is maintained through various activities such as pollution free Diwali, no vehicle day, plastic free campus, solar energy awareness etc. Rainwater harvesting scheme is implemented. Tree plantation and gardening is made wherever possible. The college has implemented two best practices i.e. Yog Vidnyan Shibir and Nutrition Week. Students response to these practices is encouraging. College has completed its Gender Audit also.

### **Institutional preparedness for NEP**

1. Multidisciplinary/interdisciplinary:	Kholeshwar Mahavidyalaya, Ambajogai is affiliated to the Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University, Aurangabad. College runs traditional courses like BA, BCom, BSc, MA & MSc. We are not an autonomous institution therefore we have to follow the university curriculum. University has implemented CBCS to all the courses and there are service course at PG level where students gets chance to select a paper from all the disciplines. After the successful implementation of NEP by the university, students will get multiple entry and exit opportunities.
2. Academic bank of credits (ABC):	As per the instructions by the university and

	<p>provisios in NEP, our institution has organized a workshop on Digilocker and Academic Bank of Credit. In this workshop we gave instructions on how to open account in Digilocker and how to create ABC ID. We instruct the students and assist them in creating these accounts. All the students of first year have created ABC ID as it is made compulsory by the University to fill exam form.</p>
3. Skill development:	<p>Our institution has some courses which are related to skill development. But we are planning to introduce more courses which will develop various skill among the students. As per the provisions in NEP we are working on it and try to introduce and implement new courses in the future.</p>
4. Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course):	<p>Our institution belongs to Taluka ( Tehsil ) area and is surrounded by rural area. Most of our students come from rural background and therefore we need to teach in regional languages. We use Marathi and Hindi language for teaching. We organize various events, programmes throughout the year to retain Indianness. Students are inculcate with our culture and it help to integrate them with the Nation. Subjects like English, we use bilingual method for the delivery of subject knowledge to understand the content in effective manner. We provide some courses which are related to Indianness like the regional subjects Marathi, Hindi, Sanskrit and Music.</p>
5. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):	<p>At the moment, college follows the curriculum designed by the university and we are bind with that. We offer various courses and conducts various activities, programmes to meet the outcomes. We encourage students to take part in various activities, we conducts workshop, guest lectures to guide them for their future. For. example we organised a workshop on Eco Friendly Ganesh Idol Making, Entrepreneurship Development, Sanskrit Sambhashan, Modi Lipi Learning, Workshop on creative writing, Guidance on provisions in various laws by eminent lawyers and judges, Environmental awareness programmes, Yoga, nutrition and health awareness programmes etc.</p>
6. Distance education/online education:	<p>Nowadays, the need of online education has increased. Our institution provide various tools/facilities for online teaching learning. We conduct online lectures, workshop, provide notes and</p>



videos, provide link of websites and you tube channels etc to give them more access to online teaching-learning process. We provide well equipped ICT lab, Language lab for the students to get more access to online learning.

##### Response:

Ours, Kholeshwar Mahavidyalaya, Ambajogai is multi-faculty college having three programs Arts, Commerce and Science. There are thirteen departments in Arts, Commerce and eight in Science faculty. Our college is affiliated to Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University, Aurangabad. The college implements the curriculum designed by the university. At the beginning of the academic year, the Principal holds the meeting of the HODs of the respective departments in the college and directs them regarding the effective implementation of the curriculum. IQAC prepares detailed Academic Calendar from the university guidelines. HODs hold the meeting of their respective departments and prepare time-table and annual plan of the curriculum in consultation with the faculties. The annual plan of the curriculum and workload distributions is put before the Principal for approval. The approved plan is converted into monthly plan by the faculty and accordingly DTR is maintained. Syllabus is completed within the stipulated time. The parent university follows semester pattern therefore the annual plan is divided into semesters. Every year new books are added to the library to meet the needs of the students. two faculty Dr. M. A. Devarshi and Dr. S. L. Pathwardhan, contributed as the member of BoS of the university and Dr. S. S. Patekar and Dr. B. V. Munde worked as special invitee members by university for curriculum framing. For the effective implementation of the curriculum, the faculties make use of modern teaching aids, like Charts, PPT, Audio visual Aids and YouTube etc. The students are evaluated through Seminars, Group discussions, Presentations, Tutorials and Practicals. Besides these, in each semester internal evaluation tests are arranged. The faculties encourage the students to participate in co-curricular activities and ask them to get active participation in the curriculum related activities as well. The co-curricular activities such as participation in field tours, different study visits, cultural activities etc. are arranged to give first-hand information to the students. To improve the teaching practices, the university organizes 'Orientation/ Refresher courses and faculty improvement programs. The faculties are encouraged to participate in seminars, workshops, conferences and symposium of their respective subjects. The teachers participate in these programs as per UGC and the university norms. Syllabus completion follow up meeting is conducted at regular intervals like month end, semester end and year end. We have developed feedback mechanism for the evaluation of the academic activities of our college. Feedback committee has collected feedback from the students. The collected feedbacks are analyzed and brought to the notice of the Principal for further improvement. Occasionally the Principal also interacts with the students regarding curriculum implementation. Our alumni also give us feedback on curriculum, informally, in their annual meet. The college regularly organizes expert guest lecturers in which prominent speakers are invited to deliver lectures on various topics.

authorized certificate courses like-Library Management Sales Representative and communicative English, under the rules and regulations of life Long learning and Extension Dept. Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University, Aurangabad.

There is no research center in the college but college conducts different activities like staff research paper, paper reading, paper presentation and most important to provide basic facilities to research scholars, computer, printer, LCD, language lab, Data analysis on computer, library, various journals and magazines are provided by the college. As a result of this 12 faculty members have been registered for Ph.D. and out of them 10 have been awarded.

There is no incubation center in the college but the college has created an ecosystem for the overall development of the students. We prepare students for the various competitions and for the same we filter them through many steps which are parts of an innovative ecosystem. Many of our students take part in debate competition, elocution, poster presentation, PPT competition etc. We select interested students for this and from them, through various rounds we choose best among them to participate in these competitions. We provide them all the needful things which help them to do best in the competitions. Therefore, many among them have won awards. One student from Microbiology department have won poster presentation prize in state level competition. We have Career Katta, a state government initiative for the preparation of various competitive exams. We conducts entrepreneurship workshop for the students.
